“Let’s get started now”, “I’m ready to serve with this ministry”, “I’m excited about this inspirational program”, “Wow, this is great and most everyone will want to be a part of this”. These were some of the comments from Tony Curtis, Jim and Yvonne Marsh, and Linda Oleson as they drove back from Morris after watching an Angel Food Ministries food distribution.

The distribution consisted of a medium-sized box of food (designed to feed a family of 4 for a week) which contained sirloin steaks, mac and beef entrée, chicken breasts, ground beef, chicken breast fajita strips, fish bites, chicken sausage, green beans, fajita blend of veggies, pasta sauce, rice, pasta, potatoes, eggs, milk alternate, and a dessert for the price of \$30. YES, \$30. What a deal! There were other box specials (seafood box, after school box, fruit and veggie box, allergen-free food box, convenience meal box) at very low prices (\$17 to \$23 each).

We will be offering Angel Food Ministries to our congregation members in July. ***This is an offer you will want to be a part of.*** The United Methodist Church has a motto of “open hearts, open minds, open doors” which will inspire and demonstrate to our community this opportunity to serve others. This program saves you money, provides good nutritious food, and is a win-win for everyone. For each box ordered, Angel Food gives our church \$1 each toward our own outreach ministry.

There are no requirements, no income bracket, and no special card to order from Angel Food. ***If you eat, you qualify.*** Members of the Angel Food Ministry will roll out this opportunity to you in June and July with an order deadline of July 20. **P.A.D.S.**

*(Public Action to Deliver Shelter)*

On April 29<sup>th</sup> Tony Curtis, Pastor Christina and I went to an informational meeting on starting a P.A.D.S. program in Kendall County. P.A.D.S. provides overnight lodging and meals for the homeless. To begin with it would be for the cold months of the year, generally from the middle of October to the middle of April from 7pm-7am. The best way for me to describe it is it will be a traveling shelter. The way it usually works is seven churches volunteer their building one night a week and furnish the volunteers to prepare the meals and supervise. Guidelines would be outlined by the P.A.D.S. of Kendall County committee.

Homelessness is a real problem in our county. Most of you have probably read in the paper that the estimate for homeless children in the county is 120 kids. This is believed to be low. The Plano district has the most children of any district in the county without permanent homes. Maria Spaeth from the Kendall County food pantry says a number of her clients are homeless (they take only things that don't need to be cooked and the children tell) they also make deliveries to the county parks.

I could go on about all the facts and figures about the homeless in our county, but I won't. These are real people who have lost their jobs, their homes, and their hope. P.A.D.S. is looking for churches to step up to the plate. We need to prayerfully consider this mission. When my boys were in sports their coaches always said, "You need to walk the walk, not just talk the talk.". Maybe it is time for us to **walk the walk**. Let any of us on the Administrative Council know how you feel about us opening our church to P.A.D.S. for 12 hours a week.

You are invited to a Kendall P.A.D.S. meeting on **Wednesday, June 2, at 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. at the Yorkville Congregational United Church of Christ**, at 409 Center Parkway, Yorkville (northwest of the intersection of Rt. 34 and Rt. 47). The **agenda** includes reviewing the progress made in the past few weeks, focusing on finding volunteers, taking first steps in forming a Board of Directors, and breaking into several sub-committees with specific tasks.

This is a new, unchartered adventure for all of us, who need the guidance of the Holy Spirit, as well as the synergism of all our combined ideas, enthusiasm, support, and energy. Please reply by June 1 to the church office (630)552-3700. Your support and participation is very much encouraged in this mission.

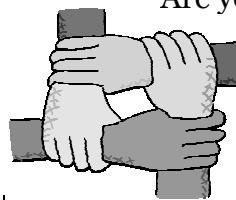

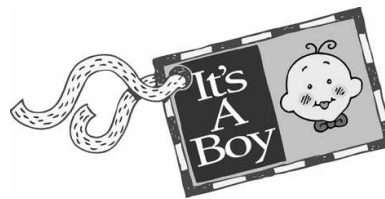

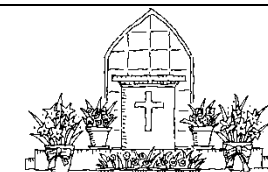
